# **Kim's Corner**

Last Month's newsletter was about SCADA resiliency. Who knew we would be putting many of these ideas to work so soon! During this virus season customers are asking for additional ways to remotely monitor their water and waste infrastructures. We are also heading into lightning season which may cause more headaches for remote monitoring and electronics. Please see below for ideas that might help you!

# We can help you to monitor your system and keep the water supply safe with these ideas:

#### Alarm call-outs:

- · Redundant media for software dialers including voice, text, and outbound cellular modems
- · Back-up robo-dialers that use voice messaging and copper phone lines.

### Physical Security:

- Intrusion alarms Flood alarms
- Smoke detectors · Heat detectors
- Motion detectors · Freeze alarms

# Cybersecurity

- Strong usernames and passwords
- Secure remote-support tunnels
- · Firewalls for Red Lion OITs and SCADA computers
- · DMZ zones between Industrial Control Network and Outward-Facing networks

#### Power Loss

- Double Conversion UPS to allow software dialer to call operators during outage
- Double conversion UPS to condition power and protect computer
- Double conversion UPS to keep Internet/DSL modems running. These may be in a different room than the SCADA computer and need a UPS
- Transient Voltage Surge Suppression (TVSS) for 480VAC, 120VAC, 4-20mA
- · Transfer Switch and Generator alarm reporting

### Additional ways to log into system

- · Add additional Webspace seats for iFix
- Add additional thin clients for Servers
- · Use existing or new Red Lion G3's or CR's for text messaging and web hosting
- · Add cellular broadband access to SCADA computer
- · Add firewalls to keep intruders out
